Fr. Shroff's Corner

The Collect Prayer from today's Mass (15th Sunday in Ordinary Time) says that, since we call ourselves Christians, we should pray for "the grace to reject whatever is contrary to the Name of Christ and to strive after all that does it honour." In other words, Christians are called to honour Christ and to turn away from sin by their concrete actions and the choices that they make. By our thoughts, our words, and our actions, we can give glory and honour to Jesus Christ: or, conversely, we can betray Him.

We live in a world of choices, many choices. In fact, "choice" is often a buzzword in today's society and is often seen as a synonym of "freedom." To be free is to be free to choose, the modern world believes, and so choice is *always* seen as a good. From the Catholic perspective, however, it is not choice itself that is the good for which we strive. What is more important is choosing what is right, what is moral, what is pleasing to God. It is not the act of choosing itself that is the good, but rather the object that we choose. If we choose sin, we are not honouring Christ. If we choose what we know to be contrary to the Commandments of God or the teachings of the Catholic Church founded by Jesus, then we are using our choices to hurt God, to betray Him. But if, on the contrary, we choose what is just and noble and true, and what gives glory and honour to Our Lord, then our choices can become like pleasing oblations that we offer up God and that cause the Heart of Jesus to rejoice.

We cannot make choices that give glory to God unless we know what God wants of us and unless we follow through and do it. Thus, in the Catholic spiritual tradition, the Saints invite us to pray for two things: (1) the knowledge of God's Will; and (2) the grace to carry it out. Both of these things are required in order to give glory to God and be worthy of the name that we bear: the name of Christian. There is an ancient expression in the early Church that goes like this: *Christianus alter Christus*. In English, it can be translated as: *The Christian is another Christ*. That is what we are called to be by virtue of our Baptism. We are called to become other Christs. It is by our following the Truth and carrying it out through acts of Charity that we, other Christs, bear witness to the One True Christ to the whole world. "By your love for one another," Our Lord said, "the world will know that you are My disciples." When the world sees that we do not think, speak, or act like others, it will understand that it is because of the Master whom we serve and choose to follow.
